STUDENT ACTION TEAM REPORT

The Student Action Team (SAT) has had an extremely successful year, actively coming up with ideas to improve our school and making them happen. Our major project teams were

Celebrating Diversity, Mental Health and **Environment.** Today, some of our SAT members will be sharing our achievements

Term 1 was a rough start with COVID as we found it difficult to meet and some of the events we were working on were cancelled at the last minute... but many of us had the opportunity to attend eye-opening leadership excursions. Back at school, we loved leading our Wellbeing Day stall where we exchanged popcorn for ideas from students and staff

Celebrating Diversity: In Term 2, we led a week-long 'Be Brave, Make Change' Reconciliation Week program with AbEd. We wanted to help the school understand more about Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, culture, and achievement. Our showcase of events included an Amazing Race, food tastings, a Kaurna class, an art workshop, and Aboriginal games. What a week!

In Term 3, we held a new event called World Tourism Day. We chose to represent Malta, Japan and Nepal on the day, sharing their culture, sport... and food, of course. The Malteze Baked Rice (which tasted like lasagne) was a hit, along with the Open Sandwiches and Nepali sweets. Students got right into the activities like origami, kick ups, and marbles... but the stars were our Nepali dancers and sumo wrestlers. The gym was full of people cheering – they loved it!

Mental Health: To start the conversation around mental health and wellbeing, we planned an R U OK? Day event with badges handed out at recess and conversation bingo at lunch. We also shared these activities (and many more) with care groups, who were able to watch the awareness video that we created, asking SAT members what they thought people needed to know. Even though it may not seem like it, lots of people are going through similar challenges. Reaching out to others can be beneficial, even though it can seem scary! You're not alone.

Environment: For our planting project, we worked with Special Ed students to plant over 50 native bushes, shrubs and grasses at the front of the school near M block. We used shovels, drills and other tools to help us create holes for these seedlings. This was a fun and exciting experience.

To combat our littering problem, we started the Care Class Clean-Up Challenge for our Junior and Middle school students, giving them a small area of our school to tidy. We're pleased to say that hundreds of students were involved, picking up dozens of buckets of rubbish. Well done!

Wider leadership: Throughout the year, many of our students have had the opportunity to lead and make a difference beyond our school. We were all involved in a consultation with YACSA – the Youth Affairs Council of South Australia – to help guide Local, State and Federal Governments. Our members have been given many opportunities to be in representative groups and on boards too, such as the Salisbury Youth Council, the Youth Environmental Council of South Australia, the South Australian SRC, and the SHS Governing Council.

It has been an exceptional experience being part of the SAT this year. It teaches students how to become more confident in themselves and around different communities. We have been preparing lots of exciting events and activities for our school... and we have so much more to come.
