







1990 has been a traumatic but very positive year for our school, and all associated with its progress. This was brought about by the development of new, but necessary policies and thinking.





Even though a blind man Emmanuel Schembri and his guide dog Ben, and five year eight girls, went in the right direction. The Mobility was still a successful event. Following that we organised a very successful social to round off the term.

In Term 2, Mrs Matsen went into hospital for the rest of the term and Mrs Buckingham helped the S.R.C. for that time. We still had a social and it was a success. Robert Jackman, our President went to Government House to meet the Governor in a special State School function. The Environment Committee had a meeting and thought up ideas on how to improve the school environment. Tamara Tomney and Doug Thornton went to a camp for SCOFS (State Council of Students).

In Term 3, the students had a strike in support for the teachers payrise claim. The whole school went out on strike and the S.R.C. talked to the media and went to Salisbury to talk to people about what we were doing and why. The SAIT President came to the school on that same day and talked to the students about the teachers stance on work bans. Letters were written to the Minister of Education and Premier of South Australia, informing them of the students views and support for the teachers campaign. From the students point of view the action taken was very satisfactory. Also during Term 3 the S.R.C. had a Conference Day and discussed future developments of the S.R.C.

Over the whole year the S.R.C. participated in many things, this may be a stepping stone for future S.R.C. members to be involved with what is happening in and around the school. I'd personally like to thank the teachers involved with the S.R.C. during the year especially Mrs. Matsen.



July Holidays Hiking Camp at Deep Creek





In the beginning we were held back by some of us not really believing in what we could produce as a group, but once we started to believe in ourselves, our achievement level rose dramatically.



All of the feedback was positive, although it was difficult to obtain comments from everybody.


Overall we all had a great time and found that we learnt alot. Especially about responsibility making decisions and co-operation.







SALISBURY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AT LAUNCH OF JOB &

COURSE EXPLORER

The JOB & COURSE EXPLORER (affectionately known as JAC) is a computer database containing details on over 500 jobs, and where training for these can be obtained. The database comes from Victoria, and has been used there for 4 years. A South Australian version has been in the development stages since March this year, and our school was chosen as one of the first to receive it. It has been installed on the computer in the Library, and is available for all students to use.

JAC allows students to select the features of jobs they would like to do (indoor/outdoor, working with tools or working with people, etc.) and then lists jobs that meet those features. Students can then use the system to find what Tertiary Institutions offer courses that will help to get those jobs.

One of the most useful features of the system is its ability to present students with jobs that might not have been considered (or even known about!). For example, I carried out a search for Medical jobs and found the usual Doctor, Nurse, etc., but I also found MUSIC THERAPIST (uses music to treat various disorders of the mind and body) and TRICHOLOGIST (treats problems with the hair and scalp).



We arrived at Wayville Showgrounds at 11.00 a.m., where we split into groups and worked our way through various display stands.


For different skills there was information available such as pamphlets, stickers, keyrings and posters.




Overall the day was a great success and we would like to thank Mr. Flynn for organising the excursion and giving the Year 11's an opportunity to watch people work in the trades which interested them.
















ARTS ATTACK







Overall my two weeks of Work Experience were great. It gave me a great deal of experience in media, both Radio and Newspaper, as I would like to enter the field of Journalism.


