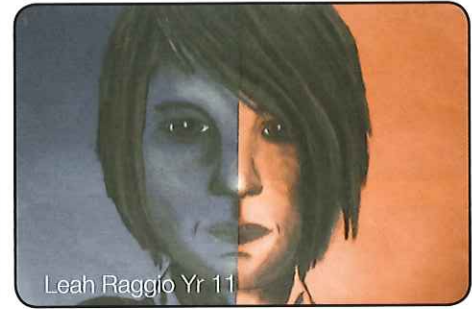
Music has been very enjoyable. We have learnt lots and it was heaps fun. We enjoyed learning about different musicians and what inspired them.

The school community deserves to be congratulated for hosting Doshisha Kori High School students during their short term visit this term.

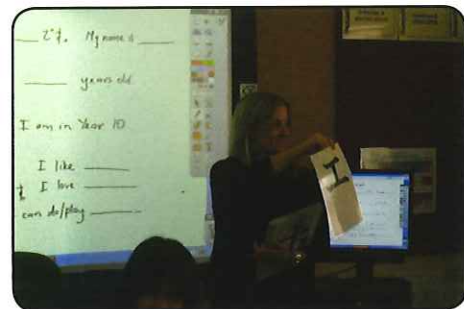

Chinese

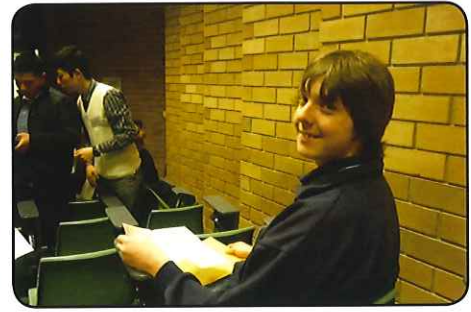

This competition is a Chinese proficiency competition for secondary school students that do not come from a Chinese background. The first day of the competition consisted of a prepared speech in Chinese and a written test. I got chosen to perform my speech last. The next day we had to do our performance and it was a bigger audience. We performed in the Wine Centre, for my performance I did paper cutting. It went well considering we only had 5 minutes to complete. For my paper cutting I cut out a tiger because it is the year of the tiger and at the end I asked the audience and the judges in Chinese "Zhe shi shen me?" which means "What is this?" The judges and a few people in the audience replied "Zhe shi Lao Hu", which means "That is a tiger". This is an insight into success camp 2009 through the eyes of two first year team leaders.

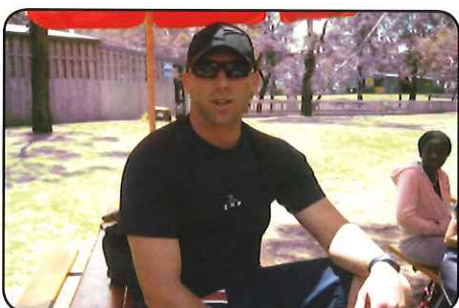

Students spent lots of time with their groups completing the challenges but they also got a lot of time to themselves to mix with friends, relax, and get up to mischief.

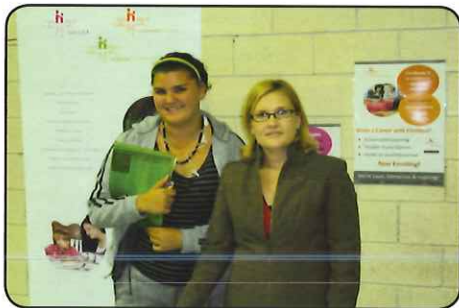
Success camp was a highly enjoyable way to end the year, make new friends and further develop relationships with teachers.
