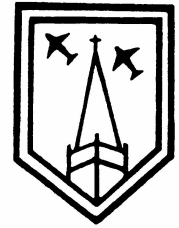

Each year we have much to celebrate, and 2004 was certainly no exception. In barely 10 years Salisbury High School has become arguably the highest profile secondary school in the State, and for all the best reasons.

There were many highlights in 2004, including a visit from the Governor's Leadership Foundation in August whose members were very impressed with staff and students, while once again The Australian newspaper has determined that we are one of Australia's best schools, naming us for our "Excellence In Learning and Teaching in Science".

Salisbury High was selected as part of the 2nd Boys' Lighthouse Education project worth up to \$100,000, one of 5 schools in South Australia.

We were successful in taking out the Bronze Award against 30 businesses in the Australian Business Awards.

Members of the staff have been asked to present nationally in many areas and we were selected to participate in a Federal Government study to determine what attributes make a high demand Government school.

The 4th Reconciliation Youth Ambassadors' Ball was a huge success and again the Guest of Honour was Dr. Brendan Nelson, Federal Minister for Education, Science and Training. The ongoing success of the Ball, now the main event of South Australia's Reconciliation Week has also given rise to other reconciliation activities in which we are involved. 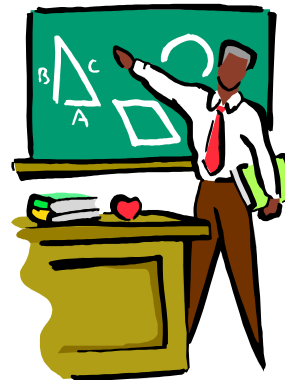

The first old scholars' newsletter for 2005 sees the year racing. Salisbury High School has been very enterprising in its endeavors to maintain a high level of service and recognition to benefit the current student population.

The school will again be celebrating Reconciliation Week with the 5th Reconciliation Youth Ambassadors' Ball on 4th June at the Convention Centre. The keynote speaker will be Federal Minister of Education, Science and Training, Dr Brendan Nelson. His first official function as a Federal Minister was to attend Salisbury High's Speech Day and, since then, Dr Nelson has involved himself with the impressive work done by Salisbury High School's staff and students. It is a feather in Salisbury High School's cap to have this recognition and old scholars can help sponsor a student to attend the Ball as a youth ambassador.

Speech Day too is another important event in Salisbury High School's yearly calendar. It gave me great pleasure to see so many more old scholars at the last Speech Day held at the end of 2004. ADAM FITZGERALD

Adam graduated from Salisbury High School in 1996 and over the years has maintained a keen interest in the progress and successes of Salisbury High School.

Since completing his SACE in 1966, he undertook a Bachelor of Arts completing it in 1999 before undertaking and completing a Graduate Diploma in Education in 2000.

Now a teacher he has caught up with several of his teachers, Adrian Flynn at a First Aid Course and Peter Dodd when he was teaching at Reynella East High School.

Adam has taught at Downs Area School, Reynella East High School, Kurna Plains and Smithfield Plains.

Outside of teaching he is a football umpire and currently umpires with the SANFL Umpire's Academy where he is in regular contact with Tony Dey (another Old Scholar of this school).

JOHN BERGAMIN

Born 10 November 1946 - went to Virginia Primary School and Salisbury High School 1960-61-62.

The son of Virginia farmers, John Bergamin travelled to Salisbury High School by train each day. He rode his bike to a stopping place on the railway near his home and alighted at a stopping place called '13 miles 38 chains' on Langford Terrace near the Salisbury High School. He later had an old, unregistered Ford Freighter traytop that he used to drive to the train each day. John recalled, 'on the way home, I used to jump off the train, throw my bag in the back of the truck and race the train home. All the kids used to wave from the train's windows as it made its way to Two Wells.'

His teachers were: Mr Dyer (Home teacher), Mr Darwin (Woodwork), Mrs Silvester (English) and Mr Haines (Headmaster). Mr McGee (Maths) was another teacher; he had a heavy Scottish accent and was known by all the students as 'Mr McGoo'.

As Bergamin was from a farming family, Mr Dyer asked him to help plant the lawn, which was to later become the school oval. It was Bergamin's job to co-ordinate the watering and the moving of the rows of heavy aluminum sprinkler pipes that were used at the school.

John was a good sportsman and his friends at Salisbury were Rick Vidovich, Gary Carlan (currently at Salisbury Council), Barry Pengilly and Gary O'Neil but his best friend was Stanley Stefanoff. The friendship remains to this day. They used to be interested in aero modelling and aviation, which was to become much larger in John and Stanley's lives as adults.

After leaving school, Bergamin went farming at Virginia growing lettuces, potatoes and onions. He bought his first car in 1966 on the proceeds of his lettuce crop: a brand new HR Holden for \$2555. His interest in aviation remained. He continued to build model planes, he became a model-plane flying instructor and in 1983 designed and built his own full-size plane before he learnt how to fly it. He trained at Parafield in 1986 and in 1988 he test flew the plane he built. He later bought an old plane and had it restored to become the plane he now regularly flies.

In 1995 John Bergamin bought 20 acres at Virginia to establish an airport. He built the airstrip, four hangars and workshop. The airport he owns is used as a base by the aero-agricultural industry, which sprays vegetable crops in the district as well as provides spraying for mosquitoes, cereal crops and bushfires.

Aviation escapades haven't stopped there for John Bergamin. He wants to be the first person to fly an ultra-light aircraft across Gulf St Vincent. His attempt from St Kilda to Pt Julia in May 2006 will raise funds for the Queen Elizabeth Hospital's Haematology and Oncology Research Unit. Dick Smith has already pledged his support with a donation.

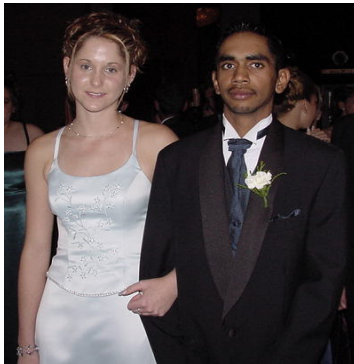
